## Human Rights, Law Reform and Accountability



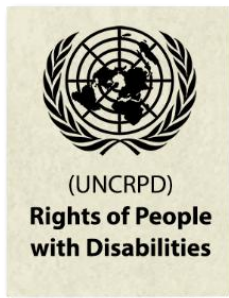
Make a new law for people with learning disabilities, autism and neurodivergence.



Make a plan that says when the Scottish Government will make changes to mental health laws.



Give more money to independent advocacy services.



Put the **United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disability (UNCRPD)** into Scottish law.



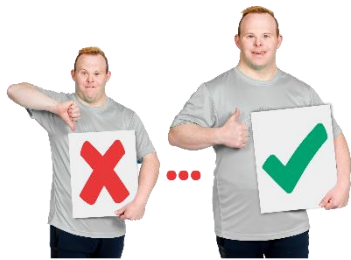
The **UNCRPD** is an agreement between countries to make sure disabled people are treated fairly and with respect.



Make **accountability** better for people with learning disabilities.



**Accountability** means making organisations do everything they can to protect people's rights.



**Accountability** also means organisations must change what they are doing if they are not protecting people's rights.

## Independent Living in the Community



Make a plan based on what the UNCRPD says about **independent living**.



**Independent living** means people can make their own choices like choosing where they live, who they live with or what they do.



Set up a clear way for people with learning disabilities and their families to get help if people are stuck in hospital when they should not be.

## Health, Social Care and Well-being



Give money and support so **Annual Health Checks** are available everywhere and are good quality.



An **Annual Health Check** is a once-a-year check-up for people with learning disabilities with a doctor or nurse.



Improve digital systems in health and social care to help record and share information about the experiences of people with learning disabilities.



Find a better way to make decisions about who can get social care support.



Stop making people pay care charges.



This will help create a fairer system that gives people more choice and control over their support.

## Design Services to be More Inclusive



Make sure organisations who get money from the Scottish Government know how to include and support people with learning disabilities.



Help make digital services easier to use and help people with learning disabilities to use technology on their own.

The **Delivering Equally Safe** is programme of work by the Scottish Government to help stop violence against women and girls.



The **Equally Safe and Supported Self-Assessment Toolkit** has been made to help organisations who support women who have experienced **gender-based violence**.



**Gender based violence** means a woman or girl being treated badly or hurt because they are a woman.



Provide full and inclusive support to any family that needs it, just as **The Promise** has said.



**The Promise** is the Scottish Government's plan to make the care system better for children and young people by 2030.
